WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Energy has designated October as National Energy Action Month to encourage citizens to save energy, water, and money, and strengthen U.S. energy security and build a more robust economy; and

WHEREAS, the American Council for an Energy-Efficient Economy, in a collaborative effort of scores of prominent advocates, companies, government agencies, utilities, individuals, and others, has marked October 5th as the nation's inaugural Energy Efficiency Day to emphasize the important role energy plays in our nation; and

WHEREAS, energy efficiency is the cleanest, fastest, most productive, and cost-effective approach to meeting Honolulu's energy needs, improving the competitiveness of our businesses, and protecting our environment; and

WHEREAS, reliable, affordable energy is vital to Honolulu's economic prosperity, and the production and usage of energy is an integral part of our lifestyle to optimize energy use and impacts our national resources; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, KIRK CALDWELL, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, do hereby proclaim October 5, 2017, to be
