Whereas, reliable, affordable energy is vital to our economic prosperity, and energy efficiency is the most productive and cost-effective way to meet our energy needs; and,

Whereas, implementing clean energy policies and programs helps boost economic opportunities and job creation while continuing to move toward a sustainable future; and,

Whereas, reducing energy consumption through energy efficiency practices can help low-income Cincinnati residents that have a high energy burden, which is the percentage of their income dedicated to paying utility bills; and,

Whereas, together the residents of Cincinnati can continue to contribute to our sustainability efforts by implementing energy-efficient technologies such as purchasing Energy Star certified appliances, installing LED lightbulbs, increasing home insulation, air sealing homes, and by practicing smarter energy use in their daily lives;
