WHEREAS, reaching these emissions reduction goals will require everyone to practice smarter energy use in their daily lives and work; **NOW THEREFORE**



Energy Efficiency Day


in Fairfax County, and urges all residents and businesses to join in our sustainability efforts by moving toward greater energy efficiency now and in the future.
